

PERRY ELLIS INTERNATIONAL, INC.
CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

Perry Ellis International, Inc. is committed in working towards supporting and complying with Section 1502 of the United States Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act (Dodd-Frank Act) pertaining to the trade of conflict minerals (the “Rule”).

As mandated by the law, all publicly traded companies or issuers are required to disclose their use of conflict minerals – defined as Cassiterite (Tin), Columbite-Tantalite (Tantalum), Wolframite (Tungsten) and Gold - which are necessary to the production or functionality of its products, and are also required to disclose whether these conflict minerals originated in the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) or an adjoining country (together with the DRC, “Covered Countries”).

Perry Ellis International, Inc. is determined to support the Conflict Minerals Rule’s efforts to reduce the funding of the armed groups in the DRC and the neighboring countries, leading to regional conflicts. In doing so, we are committed to sourcing our products in a socially and environmentally responsible manner. In accordance with the Rule, Perry Ellis International, Inc. undertook due diligence to determine the Conflict Minerals status of the necessary conflict minerals used in or for the functionality of our apparel and accessory products. Perry Ellis International, Inc. will continue to utilize the OECD Due Diligence Guidance for Responsible Supply Chains of Minerals from Conflict-Affected and High-Risk Areas (“OECD Guidance”), an internationally recognized due diligence framework.

Perry Ellis International, Inc. also requires and expects cooperation from our vendors and suppliers to comply with the Rule. Vendors and suppliers are expected to familiarize themselves with the OECD Guidance and are required to complete the EICC-GeSI conflict minerals reporting template and submit it within the given timeframe. Vendors and suppliers must also cooperate with Perry Ellis International, Inc. to make

available full material declarations that identify the source of origin and the amount of conflict minerals contained in the Products. Also, Perry Ellis International, Inc. expects its vendors and suppliers to use mines and smelters certified as conflict free (“CFS”) when sourcing conflict minerals.

Perry Ellis International, Inc. recognizes the importance of mitigating the risk that conflict minerals necessary to certain of our products could benefit armed groups in the Covered Countries and is working diligently to enhance our due diligence efforts and ensure full compliance.
